Lecturers get up to speed

RECORD-BREAKING cyclist Graeme Obree was cheering on lecturers just back from their festive holidays at Lauder College yesterday (Wednesday).

Kick-starting the 'e-Olympics', Graeme was speaking about his experiences to encourage staff to adopt new ideas when designing learning materials for students.

Staff development manager Geraldine McLuckie said the e-Olympics programme would train staff in online learning.

"Lauder is at the forefront of e-learning in Scotland," she said.

"Some of Lauder's programmes are

now available as online packages allowing out students to study while in the work place or at home, learning at times convenient to themselves."

The college already offers business, childcare and education units through online learning.

Ms McLuckie added, "I am sure Graeme will inspire staff to come up with new ideas. He himself was responsible for several new design concepts for racing cyclists and changing the look of the traditional cycle."

Obree is Scotland's world record speed cyclist and held a host of world records in the 1990s.
